Objectives and priorities

- Supporting members in delivering safe, effective and accountable perpetrator work.
- Up to 50% of the budget for direct work with perpetartors.
- Tied directly to the quality of work.
 - Compliance with standards self-assessment.

Available grants:

- 30 000 EUR
- 35 000 EUR for organisations who want to apply for an additional 5 000 EUR for assessment for accreditation

Who can apply?

Applicants must fulfil all the criteria listed below:

- Be a full member of the WWP European Network (affiliate members, as well as organisations who have membership through a national network, will not be eligible).
- Be a legal entity and non-profit organisation.
- Work directly with people who perpetrate violence in close relationships or indirectly as National Networks of Perpetrator Programmes.
- Be established in a Member State of the European Union (including overseas countries and territories (OCTs).
- Respect EU values as laid down in Art.2 of the Treaty on European Union and the EU Charter of Fundamental Rights.

Activities that can be funded

- Training;
- Capacity building;
- Running and ensuring continuity of perpetrator programmes (max 50% of the budget)
- Activities for the improvement and evaluation of the quality of service (including an external process);
- Setting up or improving the evaluation of the programme;
- Improving support to victims and collaboration with victim support services;
- Improving coordinated community response;
- Improving specialized interventions for specific groups of perpetrators;

- Improving intervention aiming at child protection (including programs for perpetrators that are fathers, development or improvement of the child protection policy);
- Improving risk assessment;
- Improving informatization of data collection and data management;
- Improving advocacy capacity /reach with local administrations and key public authorities to improve multi-agency work.
- Working towards European accreditation, including assessment of the perpetrator programme along the European Standards for Perpetrator Programmes.

Procedure



Each project will be evaluated by 2 independent, expert evaluators



Cost effectiveness will be evaluated



The final review and decision will be made by the Selection Committee



Each applicant will receive written feedback on their application.

Evaluation criteria

Operational capacity

- know-how, qualifications, and resources needed to implement the project
- Evaluation of the cost-effectiveness of the project proposals
- Relevance
 - to the objectives and priorities of the call
 - to the gaps identified as part of the self-assessment tool or last year's assessment
 - to the described needs of the organisation and local context

Quality

- methodology, planning, monitoring and evaluation
- ethical considerations e.g. Implementation of the gender perspective
- European added value
- Impact
 - expected results and how they will be integrated long term
- Programme implementation

Timeline and budget

Timeline and budget planning

Length of the project – maximum 7 months 1.05 – 30.11.2025

Overall budget avaiable:

• EUR 157 500

Financing – 100%, no co-funding needed

- A detailed budget has to be submitted with the project using the template provided (available in the call and on the grants platform).
- Project budgets available:
 - 30 000 EUR
 - 35 000 EUR for organisations who want to apply for an additional 5 000 EUR for assessment for accreditation
 - 4 000 EUR lump sum for assessment costs
 - 1 000 EUR for other costs

Payments and reporting

All payments will be made in lump sums based on meeting project goals, monitoring and technical reporting.

- Initial payment after signing the grant agreement
- Mid-term payment after submitting an interim technical report
- Final payment after submitting a final technical report
- + regular meetings with the grants officer

Site visits are possible if necessary/helpful.


